### II. President's Report and Discussion (including written) - J. Davis

### Contract and budget campaigns

News coverage of our contract campaign is forthcoming in next few weeks in *Politico, The Chief*.

Development of bargaining agenda: the Bargaining Team and Demand Development Committees continue to meet, with a goal of sending a bargaining agenda for the DA to review in early December.

CUNY announced the Fiscal Year 2024 budget request this afternoon:

- \$419 million increase to operating aid (\$324 million for senior colleges + \$95 million for community colleges)
- \$983 million capital request

The Board of Trustees Committee on Finance will review and vote on it Monday, Nov 21, then it goes to the full BoT for final approval.

### Medicare Advantage/Admin Code change

The PSC is opposed to the Administrative Code change and has mobilized members to send 5600 letters to City Council representatives and developed a proposal outlining cost savings that would allow renegotiations to the Health Savings Agreement. The PSC's goal is to preserve quality and access.

President Davis urged Delegates to attend an immediate action: The People's Plan NYC Coalition, Tue Nov 22, City Hall, 9am: #NoMoreCuts Rally to Protect City Services for Working Class New Yorkers - same day as Council stated meeting.

### **Health and Safety**

Bronx Community College PSC chapter challenged the BCC administration on heating problems. The evening of Tuesday, November 15, BCC President announced remote work and instruction through Thanksgiving weekend, with the exception of certain programs. An outrageous and avoidable turn of events, an insult to and a burden upon faculty, staff, and students. This is also an issue of racial justice - 93% of BCC students are Black and Latinx - and an issue of environmental justice.

The PSC Health & Safety Committee continues to do great work:

- Workshop on Advocating for Workplace Health & Safety through the Public Employee Safety and Health Bureau (PESH) on Wed 11/16.
- Workshop on mold and workers rights the evening of Dec 7.
- Support for chapter initiatives

#### **Remote Work Agreement:**

The union has had preliminary discussions with the Chancellor. We will push for a continued remote work option into 2023 at the next Labor-Management meeting.

#### **Academic Workers on Strike:**

The PSC issued solidarity statements in support of the 48,000 University of California academic workers on strike and for part-time academic workers on the strike at the New School. The PSC will organize groups to support picket lines at the New School.

### KCC (Scott Cally)

There was an incident at KCC. Details are still forthcoming from the college. A student was detained by campus officers in the cafeteria after an altercation. At some point, the NYPD was called and took the student away in handcuffs, and the student was later released.

### III. Legislative Report - L. Elliott - Negri

General Election - The General Election did not change the terrain In NY. The Democrats control the Executive and both Legislative branches, although there is no supermajority.

We are in conversation with NYSUT about a public higher education statewide agenda.

The mayor released cuts yesterday, which will eliminate 79 positions at CUNY by not filling vacancies (with DC37 and PSC members). There is no need for mid-year cuts in the budget.

### IV. Committee Report - Anti Bullying Committee

A. Jeu made a slideshow presentation to the DA. The ABC committee will be meeting with CUNY at labor/management to present their committee report, findings and recommendations. The committee report, provides recommendations and best practices. A. Jeu provided an overview of all the ABC events over the past year, including the launch of the PSC Anti-Bullying Campaign and know your rights trainings, anti-bullying toolkit and survey questions and formed PSC campus support teams for bullying prevention on all campuses.

Coordinator of Contract Enforcement: We have completed interviewing initial candidates for the Coordinator vacancy created by Faye Moore's promotion, and will make a determination on next steps soon.

Finance Director: Walter Santana is no longer employed by the PSC. Faye Alladin has graciously come out of retirement to serve as Consulting Finance Director until PSC hires a replacement. We have posted the vacancy and are conducting a national search.

Receptionist: We have interviewed the two finalists and are nearing a decision. We expect to make a hiring decision in the next week.
